Carlos Campetti's visit to the USA at this time has started here in Austin, then he visited the




groups in Houston, Dallas and Chicago, returning to Brasilia where he lives with his wife and two children.

Biography – Eurípedes Barsanulfo

Born on May 1st, 1880, in the city of Sacramento, MG, Brazil, Eurípedes Barsanulfo became aware of the Spiritist Doctrine through books from Allan Kardec and experiences in the Doctrine Centers.



After receiving a message from a Spiritual guide, and after being convinced of the importance and beauty of the Spiritist Doctrine, Eurípedes Barsanulfo devoted the rest of his life to working in several ways in

accordance with the teachings of Spiritism. His intentions and work were not always supported (several times opposed) by his family and many members of his community. Despite this, he developed educational and charitable activities through the organization Grupo Espirita Esperança e Caridade which he founded in 1905.

Two years later, he founded the Allan Kardec School. Over the years, he became a well-developed healing medium, and used this opportunity to help hundreds of families in need.

Under the orientation of Dr. Bezerra de Menezes, he founded the Farmacia Espirita Esperança e Caridade – a place dedicated to the medical treatment of all in need of help. Needless to say, none of his work had financial profit as a goal.

From 1907 to 1912, he served his city as a politician, another way he found to positively contribute to his community. Eurípedes Barsanulfo died in 1918, leaving us with great example of a positive and constructive existence.

An Wonderful Opportunity Volunteer Work at Kardec Spiritist Group of Austin

On June 11th, 2011 our volunteer group visited for the first time the Austin Children Shelter with the purpose to help and serve those in need. Every month our group has been planning one activity to promote entertainment and interaction for the kids at the Austin Children Shelter always bringing some refreshments and treats that normally they do not have access to, like sodas and cookies. More importantly, every visit the group tries to be in connection with our spiritual guides for a peaceful and healing environment that may promote the well-being of the children. Today after more than one year meeting (or playing) with these kids living at the organization we had the opportunity to hear from the coordinators of the volunteer group talking about their experience.



What is the most important part of the work and/or the opportunity to meet the kids for you?

Fernanda: "All we need is love"!!!!!!

Cassia: Love, attention, fun, and educational activities to brighten their day and enlighten their minds. All we can do is to bring something positive to their difficult lives.

Aline: I believe that the most important part of is the love felling that each volunteer brings to the work to do something special and the will to bring something that will make the difference to these kids' day. I believe that all these love act as a door for our spiritual group to act on these kids attending each of their needs.

How does each visit and volunteer work make you feel?

Fernanda: Each one of us has challenges. I learn a lot from these kids, and every time I leave the shelter I am feeling very happy and filled with energy. It is like I went there to be healed by them and not the opposite. The spirituality is working on all of us.

Cassia: I feel like I am doing something positive for the kids, even though I am not solving anyone's problems. Sometimes, I feel upset for the things I see there. I wish the world was a better place and that is why this type of

volunteer work is essential to every community.

Aline: I am touched to see how many kids are neglected by their families. But I know that at the end of each visit to the shelter each of the kids (even the ones that did not participated in the activities) were been helped even though we do not see it. I always leave the shelter with this certainty that the spirituality is there taking care of each one of them.

What do you feel the group have accomplished after more than a year of work?

Fernanda: Perhaps we have taken some enjoyable moments into their lives, and some healing to their hearts.

Cassia: Also, we demonstrated that we care about their wellbeing.

Aline: that our group has grown and learned a lot with this experience.

Do you have a story/moment that touched you most and you want to share with us?

Fernanda: Among many occasions, capoeira was a magical moment. Alex wanted to volunteer there often, and one boy really discovered himself in capoeira.

Cassia: I believe that every time a child smiles to us and demonstrates that he/she is happy having us there is a magical moment in itself. The simplest things are the ones who touch my heart the most.

Aline: There were many moments that touched me in our meetings; each visit to the shelter is a very special moment. But I do remember one day that we had karaoke and the older kids were participating and singing and the younger ones were playing and dancing with us. Everything was flowing so well and the energy was just wonderful. This was a really magic moment.

At this point, a bit over one year of volunteer work we are not able to measure how much we brought to the kids and definitely the group was not able to solve anybody's problem. But, more and more people have been joining the group and have been touched by these kids and if there is one thing that can assure is how much the group has been learning with each experience and that our spiritual friends are present in the life of each of these kids and volunteers.

"Can Spiritism Improve Our mental Health?", The Spiritist Magazine



The author of this article, Paula Schmidt is a clinical psychologist and member of the Spiritist Society of Baltimore and has been interested not just to develop her spirituality but also to learn what spiritist practices could contribute to the mental health of her patients.

After experienced herself specialized treatments such as prayer, books and cds, meditation, Gospel at Home, fraternal counseling, passes and fluidified water Schmidt testify to Spiritism effectiveness to contribute to the wellbeing of a person.

"Spiritism offers practices for the maintenance of mental health and treatments for mental disturbances" says Paula. The prayers are explained as opening our

hearts to our creator with a natural out pouring of words asking for ourselves, others, the world and developing gratitude for the spiritual help already received. Many books such as Living and Loving physycographed by Divaldo Franco (Joana the Angeles) provide illuminating thoughts to begin our day and to clear the effects of the day before going to sleep. Divaldo Franco also produced some meditation CDS that helps us to eliminate stress and when used on a daily basis potentiates mental health treatments.

The gospel at home done weekly strengthens not juts our mental health but the mental health of our whole family says Schmidt.

Passes can facilitate the release of negative energies by the permutation of

beneficial spiritual fluids and fluidified water can be spiritually magnetized to be used throughout the week between the spiritual treatments to further support the person's return to wellbeing.

Paula also adds that not just the spiritist treatments in a center are effective but also she found that the spiritists themselves to be exceptional role models of Spiritism with their "warmth, generosity, and loving acceptance and encouragement of everyone they meet is genuine and provides a healing balm so necessary in these stressful times".
